Two Campuses, One Mission

As another summer draws to a close, I am filled with gratitude for the ways God has continued to lead, provide for, and expand the mission of The Storehouse. On this very date last year, I shared our vision for our two campuses and the opportunities they would create for us to expand our service to our neighbors. (You can read that [email here.](#)) Today, I am excited to share an important next step in our vision.

From the beginning of the purchase of the Christiansen Family Campus, we have been committed to completing the renovation of our new campus without taking on debt. Our commitment has required us to move thoughtfully and in phases, allowing our resources and funding to guide the pace of our progress. While this approach has required patience, it has also allowed us to be good stewards of the resources entrusted to us.

I am thrilled to share that, through funding received from many generous individual and foundation funders within the last year, we are now able to move forward with the complete renovation of The Addy Foundation Building, one of the two buildings on our campus. If construction goes according to plan, renovations will be completed in January 2027.

This is such an exciting milestone for The Storehouse! The Addy Foundation Building will provide the space we need to expand the reach of several of our programs and create new opportunities to serve our neighbors. Beginning in the first quarter of 2027, we anticipate moving some Academy and Project Hope programming into the building, with fuller programming anticipated by the second quarter of next year. Our Seven Loaves Food Pantry will remain on the St. Andrew campus, continuing to provide food to our neighbors from the place that has been home to this program since our inception in 2009.

As we prepare for this next chapter, we will continue to keep you informed about renovation through "Candace's Corner" in our Storehouse email newsletter. In this section, I will share updates about the renovation, our programs, and what is happening across both campuses. We will also continue to update our expansion page on the Storehouse website with additional information and progress.

This expansion remains a tremendous blessing and a testament to God's faithfulness to The Storehouse. We are deeply grateful for the generosity and commitment of the many people who have made this progress possible, and especially for you - our volunteers, donors and supporters - who continue to stand behind our mission to feed, clothe, and care as neighbors in one community. I truly believe the best is yet to come for The Storehouse.
